In addition to volunteering, students will explore Kenya's natural and social environment: they will hike to waterfalls, visit coffee and tea plantations, learn about rural and urban life in the country, enjoy sports activities with the community, and discover essential aspects of Swahili culture and language.

Gatanga Village

During their stay, the group will be accommodated at Gatanga Village, in two houses offering rooms of different types and capacities. Students will be divided by gender and assigned to different rooms according to availability and size. These houses will exclusively accommodate students from Affinitas Schools, along with accompanying teachers and the trip coordinator, thus ensuring a safe, controlled environment conducive to camaraderie among classmates.

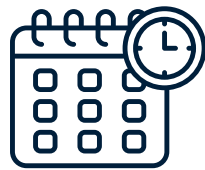

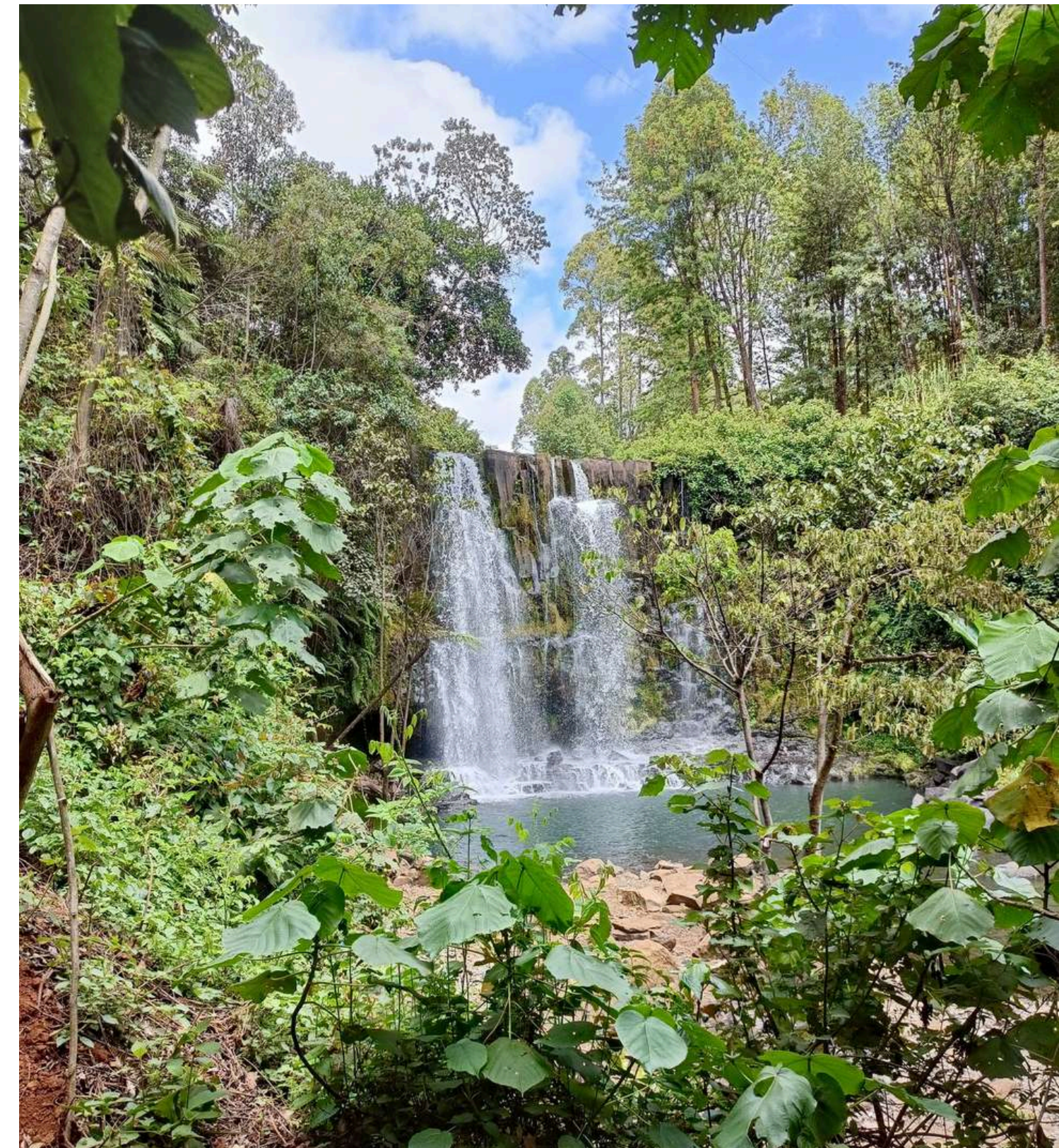

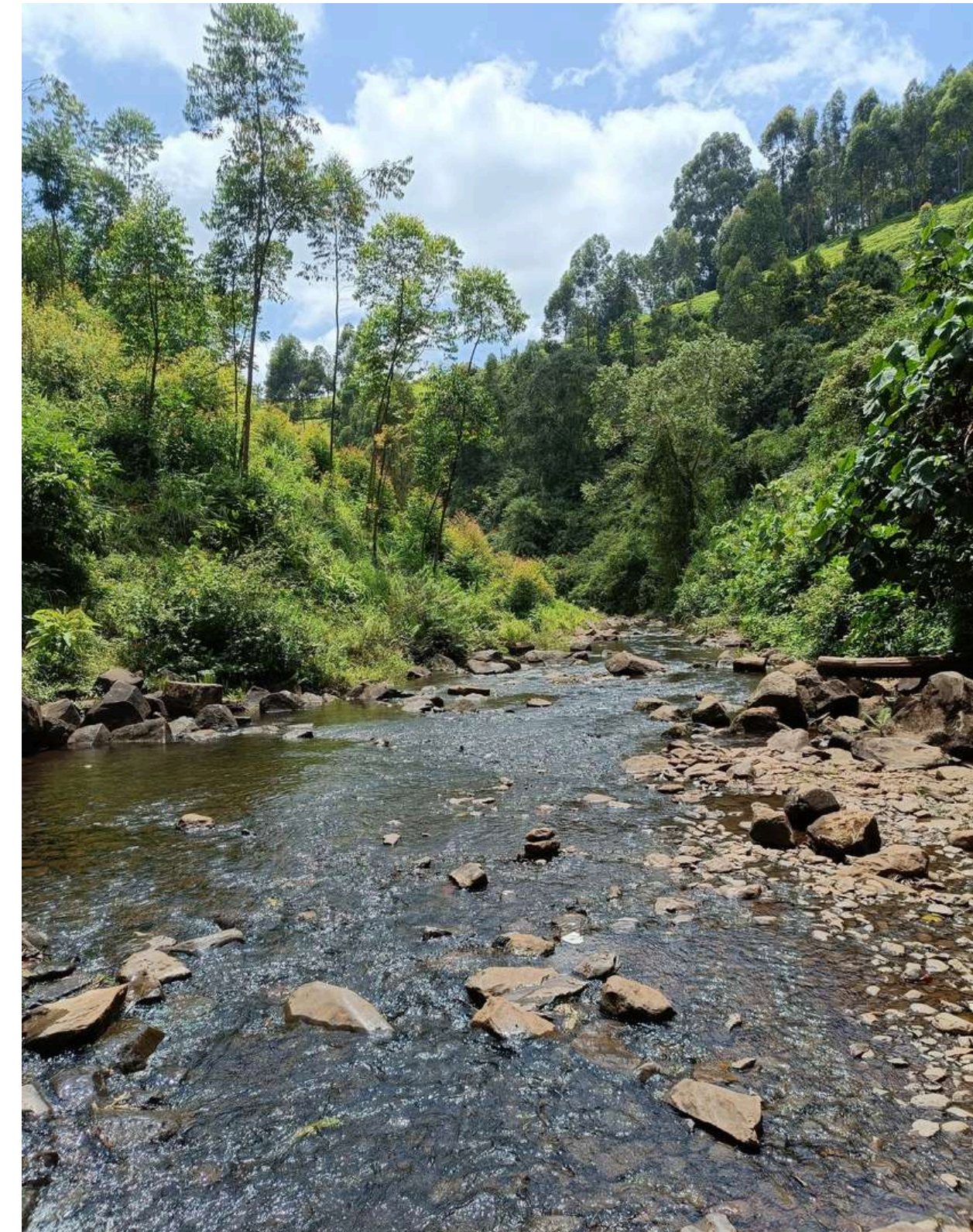

Flights from Madrid

Madrid will be the meeting point for all students. Once we know all the interested students, we will let the families know how much the flight is and the flights schedule. Please note that depending on the schedule, the arrival and departure date can be modified by one day.



Vaccine

Mandatory: There are no mandatory vaccinations for travellers from Spain.

Recommended: COVID-19, yellow fever, hepatitis A and B, typhoid fever, polio, tetanus-diphtheria and meningococcal disease. Vaccination against rabies is also recommended, but only in cases of direct physical contact with wild animals. With regard to drug treatment for malaria, it is advisable to contact a doctor or hospital specialising in travel medicine before departure.

All students are required to contact the international vaccination centre and make an appointment.

Kenya Impact Challenge | From Learning to Action

This trip to Nairobi (Kenya) is not just a trip. Mission

- Design a realistic strategy for selling 300 handmade baskets.
- Contact companies, organisations and potential partners who could support their marketing.
- Come up with creative solutions to give the project continuity, beyond a one-off sale.
- Understand how social entrepreneurship can generate economic impact, autonomy and dignity.

Why this challenge?

- Connect learning with real life.
- Develop skills such as leadership, communication, critical thinking and teamwork.
- Help students understand that volunteering also involves listening, collaborating and empowering, not just helping.
- Encourage them to become agents of change, capable of creating sustainable solutions.

 This challenge is not just about selling baskets, it is about creating opportunities, building bridges between cultures and demonstrating that learning can transform realities.
